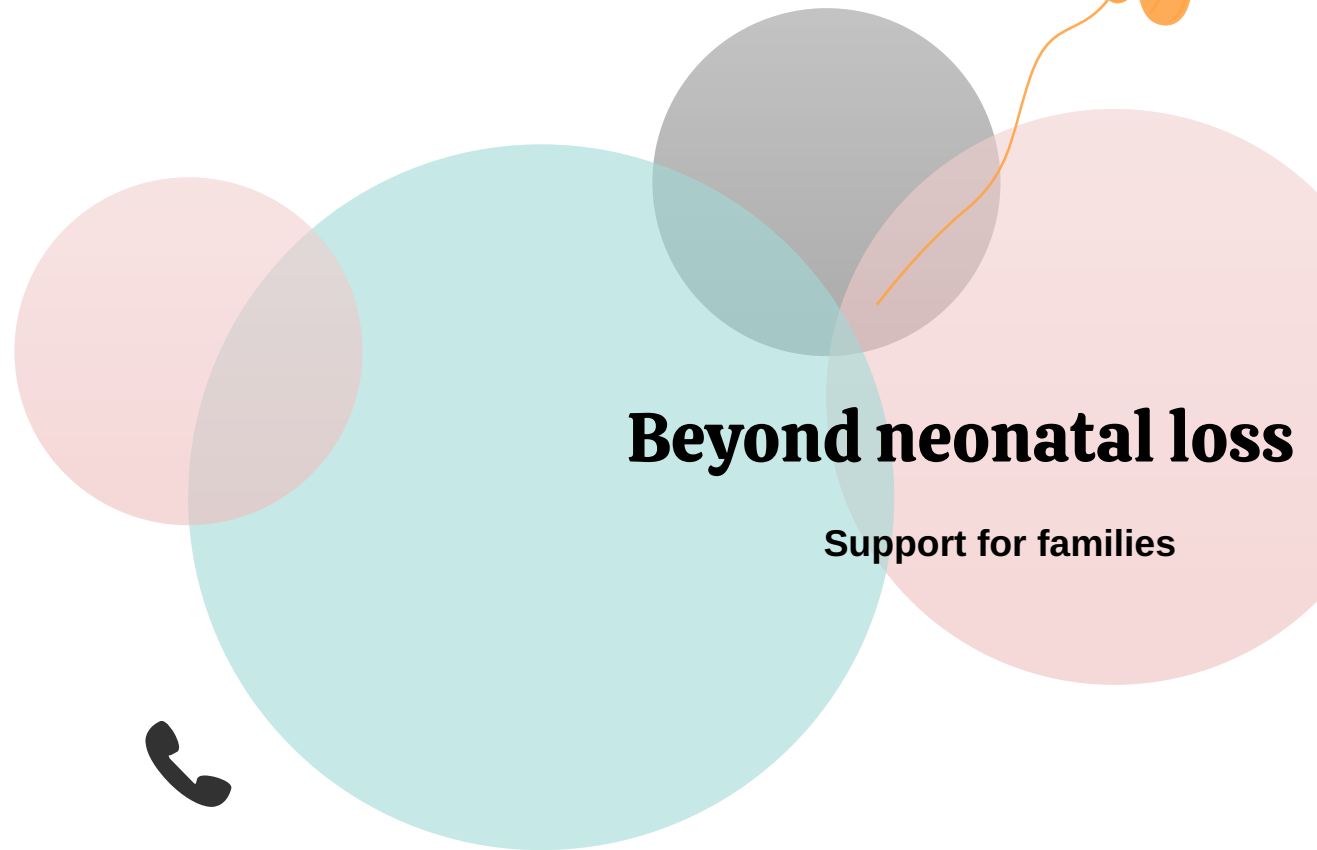

The aim of this brochure is to help you in the next steps that need to be accomplished and answer some of the questions that may arise.

Memory box

The memory box is intended to help you remember your child with small objects and ease the grieving process. Please, do not hesitate to tell us if there is any particular memory you may want to keep.



Grief

Death at any stage of life is considered a great loss. Each person faces grief in a different way and requires its time to recover emotionally and psychologically. It is really common to deal with many feelings such as pain, anger, guilt, confusion or fear. Therefore, in some cases, it may be necessary to receive psychological support.

The psychologist from the Neonatology Unit will get in touch to offer their help and guide you through the grieving process. You may also request psychological support through your Primary Care doctor, if necessary.

First days

There is legal paperwork that needs to be sorted, such as registering the baby in the Civil Registry. You can receive more information about it by going to the Social Services of this hospital.

A member of the Neonatology Service will call you to make an appointment, in which the clinical report of your baby will be delivered and explained, as well as the results of pending tests and, if applicable, the preliminary results of the autopsy.

In case of an autopsy, the final results may take several months, so they will contact you again to deliver the final report.

This information can be delivered by mail or personally, but we usually recommend you to come to the hospital to answer questions more closely.

The family

The loss of a relative causes an emotional impact on children, especially in the case of siblings, who will also experience their grief, so it is advisable to allow them to share and express it freely.

Breastfeeding

If you were breastfeeding your child, you will receive information from the healthcare staff on the steps you need to follow. You can also contact the Milk Bank of this Hospital.
